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| Democracy | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• School Council and encourages pupil to become involved in the decision making process and ensure they are listened to in school. Members of the School Council are voted for by pupils so they are aware that decisions are made in a democratic way.• School Council meetings are held regularly which feed into class council meetings where issues are discussed and debated.• Debates are held as part of the curriculum helping children to defend a point of view. |
| Rule of Law | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Children understand the school rules; the school council and all pupils were involved in their creation.• Assemblies/circle time help children understand how rules protect us all as individuals and communities.• A strong PSHE curriculum helps children distinguish between right and wrong.• Y6 children take part in Crucial Crew which promotes good citizenship.• Safety and E safety messages are promoted through the curriculum and through assemblies.• A clearly structured behaviour policy which is shared with parents/carers and children. |
| Individual Liberty | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All staff and the Inclusion Team ensure children develop self esteem and self confidence.• The PSHE curriculum ensures children are taught about sex and relationships.• The behaviour system ensures that children take responsibility for their own actions.• Children are given roles and responsibilities within school, School Council, Register monitors, Digital Leaders.• Children are taking part in a project with Brinsworth Comprehensive School called OSOC (One School One Community) which involves the older children discussing current issues with our children in a very frank way including racism, sexual exploitation, current news events, events around the world, e.g. refugee crisis etc. |
| Mutual Respect | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mutual respect is the basis of our school rules. We encourage all children to be tolerant and respectful of those of different faiths and beliefs. This is done by providing the children with an understanding of the main festivals and key dates of significance to British and other cultures e.g. Remembrance Day.• Children and the whole community are involved in raising money for charity through Red Nose, Day, Comic Relief, Children in Need and others in conjunction with the Parent Council e.g. local Children's Cancer Hospital. |
| Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Through our RE curriculum children learn about different faiths, religions and cultures.• Assemblies throughout the year inform about celebrations of different religions and cultures.• Discussions regarding Political events taking place in Great Britain and across the world.• The OSOC project supports our work in the area. |
