

PE kit

Children must have a separate change of clothes for PE. Your child will do PE on Tuesday. However we recommend that PE kits are kept at school to allow for timetable changes at short notice. As we are in the summer term please remember that PE will often be outside).

As you can appreciate most uniforms will be very similar to those of other children. We would therefore ask that all items being brought into school be clearly marked.

Jewellery

While not recommended, watches and small stud earrings may be worn for school. However, the wearing of all other jewellery (rings, bracelets, necklaces etc.) is not allowed in school as it is easily broken or lost and can become a hazard.

All jewellery **must** be removed for PE. Staff are not permitted to remove earrings, so the child must be able to remove and replace their own earrings.

Children are responsible for their own earrings, especially when they are not being worn.

Personal belongings

Valuable items, toys or games and large amounts of money should not be brought to school unless prior arrangements have been made. The school cannot accept responsibility for lost, missing or damaged items.

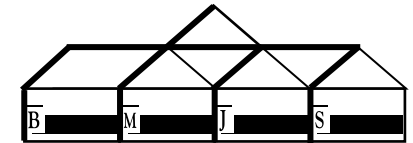

A guide to Year 3



Taking an active role in your child's learning is one of the best ways you can help your child do better in school and in life. The interest that families show in their child's schooling can have a powerful influence on their success.

We hope that you will support us as a Year 3 team, in supporting your child during this year.

The year 3 curriculum

Each half term we explore a different theme with links running through all subjects including English, Maths, Science and computing.

The project for the Summer term will be:

Summer 1 - Revolting Romans

Summer 2 - Gardeners World

Curriculum

Maths - Money, fractions, time, volume, graphs, lines and surfaces, 2D and 3D shape and patterns.

English - Learning to write a wishing story based on the three wishes story. Learning to write a non-chronological report, a recount diary and lost and found story.

SPaG - Y3 will learn their new spellings (Zappers) every morning and be tested on these on a Friday. Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar will be taught alongside English every day.

Science - During the Summer 2 term, Y3 will be focussing on rocks, soils, plants and light. Look out for information about our school trip to Longdendale.

Computing - Year 3 will be continuing to focus on using a laptop and an iPad to research our topic in preparation for a presentation. Rawmarsh CLC will be working alongside year 3 to make a video about Romans which they will show to year 4.

Art/Design - We are designing and creating our very own school garden.

P.E - Y3 will learn Cricket and outdoor games throughout the Summer term. The children will eventually compete in a year group cricket tournament.

History - the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain.

Attendance and punctuality

Attendance and Punctuality are linked to how well your child achieves. Those pupils who arrive in school on time, and whose attendance is good, perform significantly better than those who miss periods of school or are regularly late. Our school attendance target is 96.5%

Behaviour
